Note 2): **would + not = wouldn't**, means people were not willing to do something in the past.

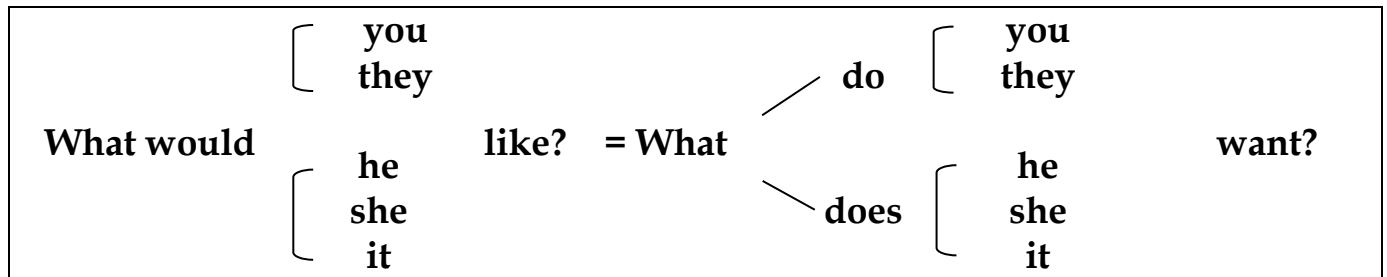
